SIGNING OUT STUDENT POLICY

For your child's safety, the procedures for signing out students for early release will require a photo I.D. Only contacts written on Student's Emergency or Census Card will be allowed to check out a student. This year, we will continue to use the Raptor System which we have acquired to help pro-

tect your children. This system is called V-soft. V-soft helps track visitors, contractors, and volunteers who come to our school. Thus providing a safer more monitored environment for the students. When visitors, volunteers, or contractors check in, or parents come to pick up students they will be required

to present a valid state-issued ID for entering into the system. The system has the ability to provide alerts on people who may jeopardize the safety of the campus. We feel this will help us keep our students/ campus safer, and ask for your cooperation in presenting your valid ID. For security reasons,

no over the phone or written authorizations will be allowed. Students should not be checked out after 3:30 p.m. Any student being checked out after 3:30 will have to wait until 4:00 when the bell rings to be dismissed.

Student Planners Policy

Every student in 7th and 8th grade at STPA has received an agenda planner. The planner is used to record homework assignments and other reminders every day. They also serve as hall passes. If a student does not have the planner with him/her in the classroom, he/she cannot be excused out of class. For these reasons, all students should have their planner with them every day. Teachers are required to check that students are writing their assignments in the planner on a daily basis. To avoid being assigned consequences for not coming to class prepared, students should have their planners with them for all their classes. We are starting the second week of school, and the teachers have been working with the students to make sure

that they are aware of this requirement. All students should take their planners home every night. Parents are encouraged to check their student's planner to make sure he/she is writing down the assignments for each class and that the assignments are being completed at home every night. A student who loses an agenda planner must replace it at a cost of \$5.00. We ask for your support to help your child to take advantage of this very important tool to teach him/her responsibility and organizational skills.

Picture ID Cards

Every student in 7th and 8th grade at STPA has received a picture ID with a lanyard. The ID is used to check out books in the library, to receive lunch in the cafeteria and to enter open

gym during lunch. Students are required to wear their ID cards at all times when on campus or school-sponsored trips or activities. We have set this expectation for all our junior high students so they may be easily identified, for security purposes. Students may switch their lanyard if the one provided is uncomfortable, but the ID must be displayed on them at all times. Teachers are required to check that students are wearing their ID cards on a daily basis. To avoid being assigned consequences for not coming to class prepared, students should have their ID cards with them at all times. A student who loses an ID must replace it at a cost of \$5.00. We ask for your support by ensuring your child leaves home wearing his/her ID daily.

DETENTION / CONFERENCES

Detention for Tardiness

Any student arriving late to class is considered tardy and is assigned after-school detention. Students have five minutes between passing periods to get to their next class. This is more than enough time for students to get to class on time; however there are students who decide to walk their friends to class, then they return to their class and walk in late. Some students will be late getting to class because they went to the restroom. This is

not an excuse for late arrival. Students must report to class first and ask for permission to leave the class with their agenda planner signed. At times something happens that is out of the student's control and he/she will ask to be excused. But the policy is not about each single tardy; it's about a pattern of tardies. The teachers have been working with the students the first two weeks of school to make sure they are all aware of the policy. All students should be aware of

the consequences.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

When in question, communication between parents and teachers can make all the difference. To schedule an appointment with your child's teacher, please call the school. Parent/teacher conferences are scheduled during the teacher's conference period, or you may contact the teachers by phone or email as well. The students are divided into teams. There are two teams per grade level. Team 71 and

Team 72 consist of seventh grade students; Team 83 and Team 84 are made up of 8th grade students. The teachers on each team have a common planning period. This time can be used to schedule parent/teacher conferences for parents to meet with all core subject and some of the elective teachers.
